2. All entries without competition will be awarded first only if, in the judgment of the judge, said entries are worthy; judge's decision is final.
3. No exhibitor may be present while judging is being done.

5. Exhibitors of pumpkins, squash, and gourds are permitted to sell these items from beneath their display beginning on Friday, October 11, 2024.
6. Other entries can be accepted on Monday, October 7, 2024 evening from 6:30-8:00 pm as well as on Tuesday, October 8, 2024 from 10:00 am-no later than 12:00 pm.
7. Entries in Dept. 2, Canned Goods, must be from Fall 2023 or 2024 harvest.
8. Entries in Dept. 5, please bring flowers for display by $11: 30 \mathrm{am}$ on Tuesday so flowers can be entered and placed by 12:00 pm for the judges.

- Exhibitors must complete their own entry tags including the class you are entering them under and the number of the class for each item. All exhibitors must know the name of their entries. Only correctly numbered arrangements and specimens will be eligible for an award.
- Please bring flowers for display on Monday between 6:30 pm - 8:00 pm or on Tuesday starting at 10:00 am. All entries must be brought in, entered and placed by 12:00 pm Tuesday for judging.
- Material in the specimen classes must be grown by the exhibitor. An exhibitor may make as many entries as desired in any class provided each is a different color or named variety. Specimen flowers to be exhibited for quality only. The exact count of flowers on stems is essential.
- Please do not use paper or foam cups or plastic wine glasses for vases. Use clear vases if at all possible. If not, we may need to replace what you bring with the clear ones.
- Definition of a spray - A terminal bloom and at least three other immediately adjacent blooms, each of which is carried on an individual pedicel initiating from a common stem.

Artistic arrangement material is the designer's choice, except for these rules:

- Do not use tinted or painted plant material in fresh arrangements.
- Do not use plastic or silk flowers in either dried or fresh arrangements.
